
Re: Parent Club for the Norwegian Lundehund in the United States

Dear Ms. Lejman:

As you know, the Norsk Lundehund Klubb has desired official American Kennel Club recognition for the Norwegian Lundehund from the time the first breeding pair was sent to America, now nearly twenty years ago. We have long felt this is a necessary step to insure the long-term survival of the breed as American Kennel Club registrations are acknowledged and accepted world-wide.

We understand the need to designate a single club in your country to represent the breed before the road to official recognition can begin.
